## **Program Overview:**

### **Vince Dicarolis – Why I Will Always Be a Rotarian**

Vince recounted a harrowing story about how a small detour to the Las Perlas Islands on a sailing journey from Seattle through the Panama Canal by a fellow Rotarians' daughter, son-in-law and two friends in the end showcased the generosity of Rotarians and their willingness to step forward and make a difference. Below is an abbreviated version of the events:

- Out for a walk on a sunny day in March President Vince gets a call from a scared and agitated fellow member Bob.
- Bob's daughter and son-in-law are sailing down the coast towards the Panama Canal
- Joined by friends who will help get them through the Canal they decide to make a side trip to the beautiful Las Perlas Islands (off the coast of Panama).
- They've anchored and saw a fishing boat approaching – before they know it the boat has crashed into the side of them at full speed.
- 4 men with machetes and machine guns board the boat, hit Chris and proceed for the next 1.5 hours to ransack the sailboat, cutting communication and hacking up the interior of the sailboat. They leave stealing their dog Stella.
- Everyone is o.k. but everything, money passports etc. has been stolen.

### What Next:

- The group manages to get hold of Bob who calls Vince – can Rotary help.
- Vince calls RI in Chicago – spoke to a woman who says she can help.
- Name & phone number of the Panama East Rotary Club given...and a connection to Rotarian Nick Taylor. Vince gives information to Bob. Nick's setting up a team, he's called Bob 'we'll take care of it.
- Rotarian Marco (from Panama), was on an island a half hour away – he goes and picks up the group gets them to emergency, a store to get staples and a hotel.
- Panamanian Rotarians with connections to marine suppliers get a work group together to repair boat
- A call to Allen Sellers – District Governor in Panama results in an improved attitude in the Panamanian authorities and a Coast Guard escort through the Panama Canal.
- More help on the home front in securing a delayed passport in 30 minutes by calling a Rotarian who is a congressman and has connections at the U.S. Embassy.
- Last but certainly not least – Stella (the dog) was found abandoned on an Island alive and well!
